It was moved by Eric Myhre and seconded by Duchscherer to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

SADD National Convention
Jon and Carissa Johnson, SADD Co-Advisers, requested approval to attend the national convention on June 24-27, 2018 in Washington, D.C. Logan Munson was selected as an advocate for SADD SPEAKS and will receive an all-expense paid trip.

Reports to the Board
The secondary curriculum committee met with Eric Myhre present and the elementary curriculum committee met with Alyson Myhre present to plan for the 2018-2019 school year.

Principals' Reports
Elementary Principal Becker and Secondary Principal Baumbach reported that formal evaluations for teachers are due on April 15, parent/teacher conferences will be held on March 22 with no school on March 23, and the 3rd quarter ends on March 25, 2018; planning for the 2018-19 school year continues; North Dakota State Assessment testing begins on March 20, 2018 along with the ACT test for Juniors; Mr. Baumbach will attend the NDASSP conference in Bismarck on March 21-23 in Bismarck, Jackson Brazill qualified for the State Geography Bee to be held April 6, 2018, and Emma Duda and Halie Brown qualified for the State Spelling Bee to be held on March 26, 2018.

Superintendent Report
Superintendent Louters provided a written report of her activity during the month, which included consultation with CTS, budget preparation, preparation for security audit, principal evaluations, district application for student forgiveness program, food service audit, and a Knowledge Works grant application.

Student Board Member Report
Nick Hovey, Student Board Member, reported that Winter Fest was well attended, the juniors are working on prom, and the seniors are beginning graduation planning.

Jamie Risovi, archery coach, reported on the success of the program with 55 students participating. Through grants and donations, additional targets were purchased which provides for more efficient practice time.

Eddy County Superintendent of Schools
DeVon Allmaras, Eddy County Superintendent of Schools, reported that as a City Commissioner, she supported the variance request from the school; Eddy County will be providing monetary assistance to parents of students participating in the state geography and spelling bees.

Language revisions were made to Policy GCBB, which were based on board discussion and conducted at the previous board meeting. The effect of the revision is that report cards will no longer be mailed unless requested as parents are encouraged to access student progress on PowerSchool.

Review of Revision to Window/Wall Project

The window/wall project was over budget due to items added to the original scope of the project. By removing the items, the project is within budget. To reduce roof penetrations, an option for self-contained unit vents was reviewed. The additional cost for these units would cause the project to be over budget by \$64,121.00. However, these units are more energy efficient with less maintenance with no condenser units installed on the roof. As the Phase I project was under budget by \$75,000, these dollars remain unspent and could be used to cover the over budget amount. Mark Buckholz stated that in addition to being more energy efficient, the self-contained unit vents also include a two stage variable flow for cooling verses a single stage.

Additional questions on the project were the cost between the two different unit vent models and overall questions on performance contracting. Mark Buckholz will get the information regarding the unit vents and Mrs. Louters will call our bond attorney for clarification of the processes used for the project.

It was moved by Duchscherer and seconded by Myhre to approve the board on Thursday, April 5, 2018 at 7:00 am to have time to research questions and concerns had by the board. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Buckholz stated that warranties start after CTS commissions the project and the board approves the finished project. The goal is for the construction to be completed in occupied spaces prior to school starting.

It was moved by Eric Myhre and seconded by Alyson Myhre to approve Phase II of the performance contract with CTS of \$3,209,000 for the window/wall project with the addition of \$64,212 for the upgrade to the self-contained unit vents with the amount of \$64,212 to be paid from the unused contingency from Phase I. Roll call vote: Duda-no; Grann-yes; Alyson Myhre-yes; Eric Myhre-yes; Price-yes; McKnight-yes; and Duchscherer-yes. Motion carried with six yes votes and one no vote.

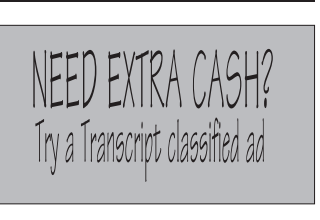

Kristi Swenson for the New Rockford Lions Club was presenting to the Lions Club is planning to do a Legacy Project at the Centennial Park. The Lions Club would replace some boards, do repairs, painting, and replace the steps on the gazebo at no cost to the city. Allmaras moved to accept the generous gift from the Lions Club to repair the gazebo. Richter seconded. McKnight abstained from the vote. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

The resident submitted the plumbing bill for \$350.00. Allmaras moved to pay the \$350.00 bill from Larsen Plumbing for the frozen sewer line. Richter seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried. Richter moved to accept the PWS report as presented. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.

Sheriff Lies was here with his quarterly report. Sheriff Liers reviewed his report with the Board. Richter moved to approve the sheriff's report as presented. Allmaras seconded. There was discussion about the warrants and border patrol in the city. Motion carried.

The bids to demolish a house were opened. J&J Stripping's bid was \$2,400.00 and Hager Excavating's bid was \$5,975.00. McKnight moved to accept the bid from J&J Stripping for \$2,400.00. Ellingson seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.

President Packard informed the board about signing a letter of support for the Central North Dakota Steam Threshers Inc. for grant proposals. The Auditor handed out the 2017 Drinking Water Quality Report.

President Packard recessed the general meeting for the Tax Equalization hearing.

Richter moved to accept the 2017 Tax Equalization report as presented. Allmaras seconded. There was discussion on the mill levy and disabled veterans. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.

With no other business, the Tax Equalization meeting was adjourned at 7:43 p.m.

The ND Department of Health was not satisfied with the way the city was handling the inert landfill. The NDDOH is recommending that the city hire someone at the landfill for direct flow the loads are separated. The city could lose the landfill if the NDDOH chose to close it down. The issue will be back for discussion at a later date.
