The proposed changes are the adoption of N.D. Admin. Code arts. 33.1-03, 33.1-10, 33.1-15, 33.1-17, 33.1-18, 33.1-19, 33.1-20, 33.1-23, 33.1-24, 33.1-34, and 33.1-35.

Some of the rules in Article 33.1-15 will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for air pollution control as required by the Federal Clean Air Act. The public hearing will address these rules and other SIP revisions and documentation for approval/delegation of air pollution programs for the Department of Environmental Quality. This includes programs that implement the New Source Performance Standards, Title V Permit to Operate, Acid Rain requirements, Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants, Asbestos Accreditation, and the Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Source Categories.
