Approval of Agenda

Approval of the Consent Agenda

Reports to the Board
The building committee met on April 2, 2018 regarding the window/wall project.
Principals' Reports
Secondary Principal Baumbach presented projected class size numbers for grades 7-12 for the 2018-19 school year. Lynnae Lies presented a Power Point on the Personalized Learning Academy (PLA), which is planned for next year. There will be an informational meeting for parents of next year's eighth and ninth grade students on April 12, 2018 with spring registration in April and May.
Superintendent Report
Superintendent Louters provided a written report of her activity during the month, which included budget preparation, administration planning for 2018-19, consultation with CTS, a notice of intent to apply for a ND Department of Emergency Services grant, NRABC committee work, interviews for the FACS and Tech and Engineering positions, preparation for the Parshall AdvancED review, team planning, and transportation scheduling and route review. Our district was chosen to receive the Knowledge Works DPI grant, which consists of 4-5 years of professional development on personalized learning. There is an Artist in Residence this week on visual arts for which we received a grant.

Eddy County Superintendent of Schools
DeVon Allmaras, Eddy County Superintendent of Schools, reported that she attended the State Spelling Bee. She has also assisted with the Eddy County Geography Bee and Math Counts. She is president of the County Superintendent of Schools and will be attending a conference on July 15 & 16, 2018.
National Archery Trip
Jamie Risovi, Archery advisor, reported that four students qualified to attend the National Archery tournament and requested approval for the trip. It was moved by Eric Myhre and seconded by Duchscherer to approve out of state travel and expenditures of \$1906 for Jamie Risovi to chaperone four students to attend the National Archery tournament in Louisville, KY on May 10-12, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.

Second Reading of Revision to Policy GCBB

Colleen Fite presented a bill from Larsen Plumbing to open her sewer service line. Larsen Plumbing stated to Fite that the city main was frozen. PWS Hirchert and Rick Swenson checked the main line on the corner and the sewage water was running. They ran the sewer cleaner out 300' and did not meet any blockage.
Ryan Hager was looking at purchasing Block 2 of Rosedale Addition and Auditors Lot 21A. The lot would be used for parking equipment and a building in the future. City Attorney Peterson will research the zoning and parking issue. The issue was tabled to the June meeting.
After a discussion on blocking 5th Street for the school construction project, McKnight moved to allow the school contractor to block 5th Street from May 29 to August 10. Richter seconded. After a discussion, McKnight amended her motion to include the street may be blocked as needed and to allow storage boxes to be placed on the pavement on the north side of the school. Richter seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.
Travis Dillman for Interstate Engineering was present about the USDA grant that the city applied for. The city could receive up to 15% grant on the water line replacement treatment plant update, Tower repair, and sewer improvements. Dillman will look at the ND State Water Commission for a grant. The next steps are to have public input meetings, design the project, and bid it in the spring of 2019. Ways to finance the project would be user fees, special assessments, city sales tax, or a combination of the three. Dillman will prepare a fact sheet on the project and financing. Allmaras moved to have a public meeting on the project on June 7 at the Brown Memorial with the time to be determined. Ellingson seconded. Motion carried.
Judy Allmaras for the New Rockford Park District was present. Judy Allmaras gave an update on the Park Manager position. The position has not been filled yet. Judy Allmaras was requesting if the City Commissioners would be willing to commit to giving more financial support for the Park Manager position. The Commission will discuss the request at the next meeting.
PWS Hirchert presented his monthly report. The city wide cleanup days have been set and are being advertised. Richter moved to accept the PWS report as presented. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.
The inert landfill was discussed. The Board is turning shut on room and the Board needs to be looking at options. The public needs to be educated on how to sort their

loads. The Board instructed PWS Hirchert to set up a schedule for a couple of days a week for residents to dump at the landfill. This would be by appointment only. The schedule would show the need to hire someone at the landfill.
Building permits for NRS School, remodel exterior; Todd Dauerhauer, siding, windows, shingles; American Legion Post 30, work to front of building; Reed Weisenburger, 24x24 house addition; Ashley Lies, place metal on roof; and Noah Ellingson, deck, siding, windows & shingles were approved on a motion from Richter. Allmaras seconded. With Ellingson abstaining, all voted for. Motion carried.

The local renaissance zone project application for Lesmeister Enterprises LLC in Block 10 was reviewed. Richter moved to approve the Renaissance Zone application for Lesmeister Enterprises LLC. Allmaras seconded. Motion carried.
