Members present: John Grann, Alyson Myhre, Todd Duchscherer, Mary Kay Price, Mike Jacobson, and David Holzwarth. Absent: Patti Larson. Others present: Jill Louters, Superintendent; Avolt Baumbach, Secondary Principal; Natalie Becker, Elementary Principal; and Janet Heskin, Business Manager.

Approval of Agenda

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Jacobson to approve the agenda with the addition of the teacher report and the student report. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Holzwarth to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consists of minutes from the August 13, 2018 regular meeting and the August 24, 2018 special meeting, the business manager report, and the bills for the general fund of \$67,362.95, the construction fund of \$658,355.45, the building fund of \$38,127.00, the food service fund of \$9,833.76, and the activity fund of \$7,808.66.

Johnson Sports Park Improvement Project

Linus Alimaras presented information on behalf of the NR Park District and NR-S School for planned improvements to the baseball and football parks located in the Jim (Legion) Johnson Memorial Park. Phase I of the project is to purchase new football and baseball scoreboards. A donation was requested from the school towards the purchase of the football scoreboard. Mrs. Louters recommended that monies from the student fees account in the activity fund be used for the donation. It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Holzwarth to provide a \$5000.00 donation to the scoreboard fund. Motion carried unanimously.

Teacher Report

Lynnae Lies and Mark Huber reported on the Personalized Learning Academy (PLA) classroom. There are twelve students from grades 8 and 9 enrolled for three or four periods of each day with Mark Huber, Kent Brown, Jordan Brown, and Brady Eichelberger each in the PLA classroom for one period each day to supervise classes in science, math, social studies and English with the students using Edgenuity for online classes. Lynnae Lies is the PLA coordinator. **Student Board Member Report**

Kyleigh Hilbert, student board member, reported that the student council is planning homecoming week, which will be October 1-5, 2018 with Rocket Spirit the theme.

Principals' Reports

Elementary Principal Becker reported on attending meetings for 504's, IEP's, and KnowledgeWorks. She has begun meetings with teachers regarding self-assessments and instructional goals and will be attending a Foster Care/Homeless Liaison training in Bismarck on September 17, 2018.

Secondary Principal Baumbach reported on the number of students taking dual credit and NDCDE classes. Goal setting for students is taking place this week and testing for students for NWEA MAP, NDSA science, and ASVAB is upcoming. There is a senior career fair scheduled at LRSC on September 19, 2018.

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Louters provided a written report of her activity during the month which included consultation/coordination with Eddy County Sheriff on ALICE training; strategic planning; KnowledgeWorks team planning; overview of Sources of Strength which is a suicide prevention program; Sick Bank policy review; East Central meetings, and review of reservoir lease.

Audit Report for 2017-18

Emil Schoenfish, CPA, was present to review the audit report for 2017-18 with the board. He stated that the report was positive with a general fund ending balance of \$1,203,060 or 28% of general fund expenditures. After a peer review, he will provide a final copy to the district and submit the report to the State for review. It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Myhre to approve the 2017-18 annual audit report as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

2018-19 Final Budget

The proposed final budget, which is a balanced budget, was reviewed. It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Holzwarth to approve the 2018-19 final budget as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Certificate of Levy

The proposed final certificate of levy was reviewed with proposed tax levies in dollars supported by mills of 68.99 for the general fund, 6.61 mills for the miscellaneous fund that will be used towards technology, 10 mills for the building fund, and 13.40 mills for sinking and interest, which generates the payment of the principal and interest for the general obligation bond construction loan. It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Myhre to approve the final Certificate of Levy as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The proposed certificate of levy and budget were available for public comment at a meeting held at 6 pm preceding the regular board meeting.

Lane Change

Mark Johnston, Craig Demester, Lori Demester and Heather Klocke applied for lane changes due to acquisition of additional education credits. It was moved by Holzwarth and seconded by Duchscherer to approve lane changes for Mark Johnston, Craig Demester, Lori Demester and Heather Klocke. Motion carried unanimously.

Extended Contract

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Price to approve an extended contract for Mark Johnston for the 2018-19 year to teach a math class during his prep period. Motion carried.

No Charge Tuition Agreements

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Duchscherer to approve a no charge tuition agreement for Kara Kelley to attend school in the Carrington School District from New Rockford-Sheyenne School District. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Duchscherer and seconded by Myhre to approve a no charge tuition for Charles Clairmont III to attend school in New Rockford-Sheyenne School from the Warwick School District for the 2018-19 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Price to approve a no charge tuition agreement for Braylon, Clayton, Dayson, Nakenya, and Mya Dubois to attend school in the New Rockford-Sheyenne School District from the Warwick School District for the 2018-19 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Holzwarth to approve a no charge tuition for Kayson Dubois to attend school in New Rockford-Sheyenne School from Warwick School District for the 2018-19 school year with no transportation provided by New Rockford-Sheyenne School District. Motion carried unanimously.

Chimney Repair

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Holzwarth to approve the bid from Coal Country Masonry to repair the chimney for \$3500.00. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Price to approve the tuck-pointing and brick repair bid from Coal Country Masonry for \$3000.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Reservoir Lease

Mrs. Louters reviewed the history of the lease we have with the City of New Rockford on the reservoir property. The school district has not been using the property for the science curriculum for the past several years and Mrs. Louters made the recommendation to end the lease. It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Holzwarth to end the lease with the City of New Rockford on the reservoir property. Motion carried unanimously. The lease will be on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for October 1, 2018.

First Reading of Revision to Policy DDA Sick Leave Bank

Mrs. Louters reviewed the proposed change to the Sick Bank policy which stated that the sick days that staff accumulate above the sick leave cap be transferred to the sick bank at the beginning of each school year. It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Holzwarth to approve the first reading to Policy DDA Sick Leave Bank.

The Board expressed that they would keep Bymoens in the loop as the project moves forward. The city has to be careful to keep USDA in the loop as to outside funding.

PWS Hirschert presented his monthly report. The crews have been busy cleaning streets, drains and repairing the snowplow. Hirschert has been working with Interstate Engineering and the USDA on the water project. Hirschert has been communicating with APEX and Otter Tail Power on the Highway 281 project. Ystaas moved to approve the report as given. Hager seconded. There was a discussion on the USDA, ADA guidelines and the airport cleanup. Motion carried.

A written report on the Water Project from Interstate Engineering was read. The utility survey is being done, RD is reviewing the engineering agreement, and the Board needs to discuss repayment of the loan.

At the Tuesday Eddy County Commissioners meeting, the county will be appointing someone to the New Rockford Zoning Board. Richter moved to approve the local gaming permit for the New Rockford Dollars for Scholars. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.

NDDOT was asking for the city to sign an Amendment to Cost Participation and Maintenance Agreement for the NDSTREET Project. The amendment is due to the drainage that is outside the project limits. The dollar amount for the city would be \$4,490.00. Hirschert had talked to Interstate Engineering about the amendment. Interstate Engineering was waiting for an answer back from the NDDOT. No action taken at this time but a special meeting may be called on the issue.

Richter moved to approve the housing incentives for Dennis Hegland & Holly Christopherson and Todd & Rhonda Dauenhauer. McKnight seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.

McKnight moved to approve building permits for New Rockford Apartments, roof and overhang repair; Scott Reis, siding and windows; Erik Carlson, privacy fence; CHI St. Alex. Health, shingles; and Vorland Land Co., office windows replaced. Ystaas seconded. Motion carried.

PWS Hirschert had solicited bids on two riding lawn mowers. Hirschert only received one bid from Erickson Implement. The city would be trading the two current mowers in on the new ones. Then would start a 3 and 4-year rotation on trading mowers. McKnight moved to purchase the two riding lawn mowers for \$7,600.00. Richter seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.

The Board decided to continue to use Rath & Mehrer for auditing, Dougherty & Company for bond counsel and Arntson Stewart Wegner for bond legal service for the USDA Loan/Grant.

The Board reviewed the Limited English Proficiency Plan prepared by the Auditor. Richter moved to approve the LEP Plan for the City of New Rockford. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.

After reviewing the Conflict of Interest Policy, Ystaas moved to approve the Conflict of Interest Policy. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.

Richter moved to approve the USDA Loan Resolution. Hager seconded. In a roll call vote, McKnight, Ystaas, Richter, Packard, and Hager voted to approve. Motion carried. Richter moved to approve the Right of Way Certificate pending approval from legal counsel. McKnight seconded. Motion carried.

President Packard gave an update on the airport project. The Airport Authority is looking into a Prairie Dog Grant to help fund the project.
