### MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING NEW ROCKFORD CITY COMMISSION NEW ROCKFORD, NORTH DAKOTA FEBRUARY 15, 2019

President Packard called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. in City Hall with Commissioners McKnight, Hager, Ystaas, Richter, and City Attorney Peterson present. The purpose of the meeting was to approve a Renaissance Zone application, concur with NDDOT that Border States Paving receives the Hwy 281 project, to approve the engineering agreement for water main project, and review options for repaying USDA Loan.

Richter moved to approve the Renaissance Zone application for Travis Steele at 7 1st St. S in New Rockford. Ystaas seconded. All voted to approve. Motion carried.

NDDOT opened bids for the Highway 281 project and Border States Paving was the lowest bidder at \$4,368,302.26. The city's share is estimated at \$193,673.02. McKnight moved to concur with NDDOT that Border States Paving should be awarded the project. Ystaas seconded. In a roll call vote, it was all for. Motion carried.

Richter moved to approve the Engineering Agreement for the Water Main Project with Interstate Engineering contingent on Rural Development approval. McKnight seconded. Commission Richter and City Attorney Peterson had conversed with Travis Dillman from Interstate Engineering to clarify several issues in the engineer agreement. The compensation listed will be the amount due by the city. There is no Exhibit H attached but is referenced in the agreement. There was a discussion on the meaning of substantial completion of the project and resident inspector. Exhibit H will need to be attached to the agreement. In a roll call vote, it was all for. Motion carried.

Richter moved to adopt Option #3 for repayment of the USDA Loan on the Water Main Project. McKnight seconded. Residents have voiced that the payment should be shared between city sales tax and user fees. After a discussion, the Board ruled out Options #1, #4 and #9. In reviewing the other six options, Richter rescinded his motion and McKnight rescinded her second. Richter moved to use \$75,000.00 from the Infrastructure Improvement Fund annually, increase the city sales tax by 1/2 percent, and increase water user fees to make the annual payment to USDA. McKnight seconded. In a roll call vote, it was all for. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:27 a.m. Minutes subject to approval at the next regular board meeting.

### ATTENTION GOOSE HUNTERS

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations from amendment number one of the 2018-2019 Small Game, Waterfowl and Furbearer Proclamation.

### 2019 SPRING LIGHT GOOSE CONSERVATION ORDER February 23 - May 12, 2019 — Statewide

- Resident hunters must have a current hunting certificate, a small game license if ages 16 and older, and a general game and habitat license (or combination license). Note: 2018-2019 licenses expire on March 31, 2019.
- Nonresident hunters must have a 2019 nonresident spring light goose license (\$50.00). This license enables nonresidents to hunt statewide for the entire duration and does not affect their eligibility to purchase a regular nonresident waterfowl hunting license for the fall 2019 season.
- All 2019 Spring Light Goose Conservation Order hunters must register with the Harvest Information Program (HIP). HIP registration for ND can be obtained with license purchases through the Department's website or by calling 1-888-634-4798. HIP registration for this conservation order is also valid for fall hunting.
- The Federal Waterfowl Stamp is not required for the conservation order.
- Only light geese may be taken. Light geese include snow geese, blue geese, and Ross's geese. They may be taken statewide from February 23 thru May 12, 2019.
- There will be no daily limit or possession limit on light geese during the conservation order and shooting hours will be from 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.
- Electronic and recorded calls, as well as shotguns capable of holding more than 3 shells, may be used to take light geese during the conservation order.
- All Waterfowl Rest Areas designated for 2018 are open during the conservation order.
- Non-toxic shot is required for hunting light geese.
