### Missouri River Safety Day

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department and Townsquare Media are sponsoring the Missouri River SPLASH – a recreation and boating safety event for everyone who enjoys the Missouri River.

The event is Thursday, May 16 in Mandan from 2-5 p.m. at Moritz Sport and Marine. Displays, hands-on activities, demonstrations, regulations, registrations and prizes are included.

The event is free, and people of all ages are invited to attend.

State law requires youngsters ages 12-15 who want to operate a boat or personal watercraft with at

least a 10 horsepower motor to first pass the state's Boat North Dakota safety course. In addition, some insurance companies give adult boat owners who pass the course a discount on boat insurance.

The Boat North Dakota safety course is free and available at the Game and Fish Department.

### Boat North Dakota Course

Boat owners are reminded that North Dakota state law requires youth ages 12-15 who want to operate a boat or personal watercraft by themselves with at least a 10 horsepower motor must pass the state's boating basics course.

However, North Dakota Game and Fish Department education coordinator Brian Schaffer recommends all boaters take a boater education course. In fact, some insurance companies give adult boat owners who pass the course a discount on boat insurance.

The course is available for home-study from the Game and Fish Department's Bismarck office. Two commercial providers also offer the course online, and links to those sites are found on the department's website at [gf.nd.gov](http://gf.nd.gov).

While the home-study course is free, students will be charged a fee to take it online. The online provider

charges for the course, not the Game and Fish Department. The fee stays with the online provider.

Upon completion of the online test, and providing a credit card number, students will be able to print out a temporary certification card, and within 30 days a permanent card will be mailed.

The course covers legal requirements, navigation rules, getting underway, accidents and special topics such as weather, rules of the road, laws, life saving and first aid.

- \*Stump Lake elevation: 1,448.83 MSL.
- \*Lake Sakakawea elevation: 1,846.31 MSL; 14,800 cubic feet per second average (CFS) Garrison Dam daily releases.
- \*N.D. Game and Fish Dept. Dist. game wardens: Devils Lake producing good pike numbers with a few walleye mixed in and occasional white bass starting to show up. No reports from east-central area lakes. Not much shore-fishing activity for pike on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Better walleye success could be farther west around Deepwater and Parshall bays for walleye but not many anglers on the water.

\*Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Anglers were finding nice walleye and pike success in Devils Lake feeder coulees and creeks prior to cold weather snap. Look for boat activity with the lake opening up.

\*Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Continued walleye and pike success in Channel A and Devils Lake feeder coulees with the bays opening on Devils Lake. Try pitching plastics. Little activity on the lake itself.

\*Foster County area lakes, Dry Dock, Carrington: Activity remains light on area lakes, although they're opening up.

\*Jamestown Reservoir, Pioneer Bait and Tackle, Jamestown: Wind and weather limiting activity.

\*Jamestown Reservoir, Sooper Stop, Jamestown: Limited activity throughout area lakes.

\*Lake Ashtabula, Ashtabula Crossing, Luverne: Ice is off with anglers catching some eater-sized walleye from the rock. A few perch and bass mixed in. Try pitching Twister Tails or plastics. Water levels have increased with the Sheyenne River running high. Some activity on the Sheyenne River.

\*Lake Ashtabula, Bayshore, Valley City: Lake is open with a few boats out but limited reports yet.

\*Lake Sakakawea, Cenex Bait and Tackle, Garrison: Some walleye success shallow on the east end of Lake Sakakawea in 6 to 8 feet prior to the cold and snow. Try the U.S. Highway 683 embankment flats with jigs and minnows. North Lake slowed. Missouri River water levels remain low with continued lower Garrison Dam releases.

\*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon/Missouri River, Scott's Bait and Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River remains consistent for walleye using jigs and minnows but access can be interesting at times with Garrison Dam low releases. Try crankbaits off the rocks at night for walleye. Lake Sakakawea continues producing pike from shore. Try any of the back bays using smelt or spoons.

\*Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: No new reports.

\*Pipestem Reservoir, Pioneer Bait and Tackle, Jamestown: Lake suffered winter fish kill losses.

\*Pipestem Reservoir, Sooper Stop, Jamestown: Some winter kill with little to no activity.

\*Spiritwood Lake, Pioneer Bait and Tackle, Jamestown: No new reports.

\*James River, Kensal: River stage, 5.16 feet; streamflow, 196 CFS.

\*Pembina River, Walhalla: River stage, 4.24 feet; streamflow, 699 CFS.

\*Red River, Grand Forks, River stage, 37.17 feet; streamflow, 33,000 CFS.

\*Sheyenne River, Warwick: River stage, 3.82 feet; streamflow, 217 CFS.

## What it takes: fun in the sun and then some

This is the fourth article in the feature series "What it Takes," which explores careers from a child's perspective. I've met new people and gotten to know others even better. I have also been able to learn about jobs that I might one day be interested in doing. Most of all, I hope that others might have learned something too.

One job I've wanted to do for a long time is a lifeguard. It goes back to when I began taking swimming lessons. I love the water and being around younger kids. So when I heard that Dennis Nybo used to work as a lifeguard, I requested an interview right away. He was kind enough to meet with me at the Latte Lobby.

Dennis has lived in New Rockford for almost two years, after he and his wife Alison (Almaras) Nybo moved here so she could be close to family. He has been working as the executive director of the New Rockford Park District since August 2018. Before that, Dennis worked in Bismarck for the Parks and Recreation Department for 28 years. This will be his first summer working in New Rockford! I wish him luck because the first year is probably the hardest.

When he was growing up in Grand Forks, Dennis was always active and loved sports. He had a coach and mentor and who sparked his interest in parks and recreation. At the University of

North Dakota, Dennis studied park administration and marketing management. After Dennis graduated, he went to work in Rolling Meadows, Ill., in the suburbs of Chicago for 3 years.

When asked what he liked best about his job at the New Rockford Park District, Dennis said "It's different every day, and I'm not always behind the desk." That afternoon he had plans to clean up tree branches in the park. The following day he wanted to help with the Rockin' Fitness Bunny Hop 5K.

He also likes interacting with people, "Parks and recreation isn't just about sports— it's about art and leisure for the people of the community." In particular he likes to see his staff grow and learn. While working in Bismarck, Nybo supervised college students who gained skills that helped them build careers in areas like teaching and business.

His people skills don't stop there. Dennis works to be proactive in his planning, and keeps community members in mind. Dennis says that it is important to consider what works for "all ages, stages and abilities" of people in the community. From walking paths to playground equipment, accessibility is big concern, especially keeping in mind the aging population as well as the newer generations. A good example of that would be our swimming pool. It has handicap accessibility AND

a waterslide. According to Dennis, this kind of planning requires him to be one step ahead in creating a vision for new and fun opportunities.

I also asked Dennis if he had ever been a lifeguard. It turns out yes, Dennis was a lifeguard 20 years ago, and needs to be recertified if he wants to serve as a lifeguard again.

The Park District is still hiring for seasonal part time positions for park maintenance, coaches and lifeguards. The

pay for the lifeguard position starts at \$10 an hour, but for those who have water safety instructor certification, pay begins at \$11.

I like the idea of watching out for others as they play and enjoy. I will be applying for a job as a lifeguard, but I will have to wait awhile, until I am 15. In the meantime, I can work toward gaining experience: First Aid, CPR, lifeguard certification and maybe working on my beach bod.

## IT'S THE LAW!

N.D. Century Code 26.1-03-1 0. Publication of abstract of annual statement and certificate of authority. An insurance company, at the time it submits its an-

nual statement for filing, shall submit an abstract of the annual statement for publication upon the form prescribed by the commissioner. The abstract of the annual statement of each company, other than a state or county mutual insurance

company, must be published at least three times in one newspaper of general circulation, designated by the commissioner, printed and published in each judicial district in this state in which the company has an agency. The abstract of the

annual statement of each state or county mutual insurance company must be published once in a newspaper published in the county in which the company has its principal place of business, the newspaper to be designated by the mem-

bers of the company at their annual meeting. The certificate of authority issued by the commissioner to authorize the company to do business within this state must be published in connection with the publication of the abstract of its annual

statement. The fees for publication are those provided under section 46-05-03. Proof of publication must be filed with the commissioner within four months after the filing of the annual statement.
