President Richter called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall with Commissioner

Wade Senger, Interstate Engineering was on the conference telephone to give an update on the water project. BEK Consulting is two thirds done on the water line replacement and is on schedule to be completed as planned. Classic Protective Coatings is ahead of schedule on the water tower. The water tower project should come in below budget. Hager moved to approve and pay BEK Consulting's bill for \$511,272.90 and Classic Protective Coatings bill for \$370,701.87. McKnight seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried. The water plant project bids will be opened on July 20 at 3:00 p.m. The opening will be streamed on the internet. The land for the holding pond is about finalized. The interest rate is down

to 1.5%, which will save the city money if USDA will close on the loan in this quarter.

PWS Hirschert was present with his monthly report. The crews have been cleaning up branches, spraying weeds, cleaning and painting corners, sweeping streets, fencing at the lagoon, and the water plant generator is up and running. There have been a couple of problems at the lift stations and water plant. There was a water main break by 5th Avenue S and Hirschert would like to add that water line to the project. McKnight moved to accept the report. Richter seconded. There was discussion on the Centennial Park trees and the city reservoir. Motion carried. A letter and bill from Naastad Brothers Inc. explaining the bill was for work done on city utilities under Highway 281 that the State was not going to pay for. The legal opinion is that it could cost more to litigate then to pay the bill. McKnight moved to pay Naastad Brothers Inc.'s final bill of \$14,520.12. Hager seconded. In a roll call vote, all voted to approve. Motion carried.

Hager moved to purchase 10 acres of land from Weber's for the water plant-holding pond at \$30,000.00. Richter seconded. Fencing the land was discussed. Motion carried.

Belquist moved to approve building permits for Heather Klocke, shingles and gutters; BR Listen & Matthew Mootz, remodel house; Ralph Tjelta, install drain tile and steps; Leslie Guthmiller, 10x7 shed; and Randy Gudmanson, 24x30 garage. Hager seconded. Motion carried.

McKnight moved to approve housing incentives for Justin Johnson. Hager seconded. Motion carried.

Hager moved to approve a local gaming permit for the American Legion Post #30. Richter seconded. Motion carried.

The bill from ND Department of Transportation for the city's share of the Highway 281 project was reviewed. Hager moved to approve payment of ND DOT's bill for \$6,187.50. McKnight seconded. There was discussion on the east crosswalk pole being to close to the frontage road. Motion carried.

The City received the 2019 Tree City USA award.

Budget discussion was about Eddy County requesting a 5% increase in the police contract for 2021 and listing a pickup truck in the Equipment Fund.

President Richter was approached by the Bison Plant about them purchasing water from the city. At the present time, the Bison Plant purchases their water from Central Plains Water District. Their consumption is 400,000 to 800,000 gallons per month. An open discussion with Central Plains Water District needs to be done, as there are legal issues to be addressed.

With no further business, Hager moved to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
