### REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO PERFORM PRELIMINARY AND DESIGN ENGINEERING FOR EDDY COUNTY

Project Overview: Eddy County has received federal dollars through the ND legislature to rehabilitate bridge #14-101-09.0 5.0 miles west and 3.0 miles north of New Rockford, ND on county road #12 (61st Ave NE). The grant funding comes through the recent special section HB 1505. The existing bridge was reconstructed in 1970 and is a single span adjacent Box Beam structure. Two spalls on bridge deck are patched with asphalt. Spall on abutment face of NW corner of north abutment underneath beam seat of box girder. Northwest corner has a 2-foot diameter broken section of concrete on the north abutment. Tilt on the abutments is SW -4.5% and SE -3.8% tilt back. NE -1.8% and NW 1.1% tilt back. The structure rehabilitation would consist of deck spall repairs, abutment spall repairs, grading necessary to accommodate end terminals, update guardrail, fixing settlement and install drain tile at abutments and repair of scour areas.

Eddy County is requesting the services of qualified engineering firms to perform environmental studies, preliminary and design engineering, and associated services to move this project to a bid letting. All services will be performed in accordance with NDDOT design procedures, and the project will be let through the NDDOT.

**Preliminary and Design Services:** Perform Project Management, Project Administration, Field/Ground Surveying, Wetland and Cultural Surveys, Draft and Final DCE, Permitting, Preliminary and Final Construction Plan and Special Provisions, and Preliminary and Final Cost Estimates. Additional services, if required, may be negotiated and supplemental agreements issued based on the consultant's performance, the consultant's proposal, and available funding.

Firms are invited to submit a proposal for the project listed above. The proposals shall provide the following information:

- Past Performance
- Ability of professional personnel
- Willingness to meet time and budget requirements
- Office Location
- Recent, current, and projected workloads of the persons and/or firms
- Related experience on similar projects
- Recent and current work for the County
- Project understanding, issues, & approach

The proposal pages shall be numbered and must be limited to 10 pages in length. Proposals that exceed the 10 page length requirement will not be considered. The cover letter will not be counted as one of the 10 pages. The proposal should list the personnel who will be assigned to work on the project, including titles, education, and work experience. Eddy County will only consider proposals received prior to **12:00 PM CST, April 4th, 2022**. Late proposals will be deemed unresponsive.

The consultant's proposal may include an appendix. Resumes, references, a statement of qualifications and other materials outlining experience may be included in an appendix. The appendix will not be considered as a part of the 10 page proposal. Each proposal will be evaluated by a selection committee.

Eddy County may conduct interviews. The County may interview up to three (3) of the most qualified engineering firms based on whose proposals most clearly meet the RFP requirements. Fees shall be negotiated with the successful firm. If the fee cannot be agreed upon, the County reserves the right to terminate negotiations, and then negotiate with the second and third ranked firms in order, if necessary, until a satisfactory contract has been negotiated.

All costs associated with the proposal shall be borne by the proposer. The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all proposals and to not award contracts for any and/or all projects. Bids will be received by the City Auditor, Becky Schumacher, at the office of the Auditor, until 3:30 pm on April 4th, 2022 and then at said office all bids properly submitted will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The project will consist of the following approximate quantities: 5,900 Ton of Hot Bituminous Patching Material, Milling, Concrete Curb and Gutter, 34,000 Ton of Hot Bituminous Pavement and a complete City Wide Seal Coat.

Each bid will be submitted on the basis of a cash payment for work. It will be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the above mentioned City Auditor, 117 First Street South, New Rockford, ND 58356, and shall be designated that the bid is for "Street Improvement District No. 2021-1." The bid shall be accompanied by a Bidder's Bond in a separate envelope in the amount of five percent (5%) of the full amount of the bid, executed by the Bidder as Principal and by a Surety Company authorized to do business in North Dakota. If the Principal's bid is accepted by the OWNER and the contract awarded, the principal, within ten (10) days after the Notice of Award, will be required to execute and effect a contract in accordance with the terms of the principal's bid and any requirements and conditions of the OWNER.

A Contractor's Bond, as required by Section 4801.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, shall be included with the executed Contract Documents. The Bid Security shall be as required in Section 4801.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code.

All bidders must be licensed for the highest amount of their bids, as required by Section 430705 of the North Dakota Century Code and a copy of the license or certificate of renewal thereof issued shall be enclosed in the required bid bond envelope.

No bid will be read or considered which does not fully comply with the above provisions as to Bond and Licenses, and any deficient bid submitted will be resealed and returned to the Bidder immediately.

The OWNER retains the right to reject any or all of the bids submitted and to waive any informality in any bid and to hold all bids for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from said date of opening and to hold the three low bids and bid securities for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days from said date of bid opening.

The work on the improvements is to commence upon a date to be specified by the OWNER, notice of which will be given to the successful bidder ten (10) days in advance of the start of construction. The Contractor will be required to commence construction, and in an approved sequence, complete all aspects of the project except the seal coat by November 1st, 2022. The seal coat shall commence in 2023 and shall be complete by July 15th, 2023.

### NOTICE OF AMENDMENT AND REENACTMENT OF SECTIONS 3 AND 4 OF ARTICLE 3 OF CHAPTER 10, PUBLIC NUISANCES, OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW ROCKFORD

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REENACTING SECTIONS 3 AND 4 OF ARTICLE 3 OF CHAPTER 10, PUBLIC NUISANCES, OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW ROCKFORD, NORTH DAKOTA:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF NEW ROCKFORD, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

10-03-03 Junk Automobiles or Abandoned Vehicles.

A. General: Police department may remove junk automobiles or abandoned vehicles. The police department may remove or cause to be removed any junk automobile or abandoned vehicle, or parts of either, from any unenclosed private property after having notified, in writing, the owner or occupant of such property of its intention to do so at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to such removal. Such notice shall be served personally upon the owner or occupant of the property, if occupied, or may be posted in a conspicuous place upon vacant or unoccupied property. Such junk automobiles or abandoned vehicles, or parts of either, shall be removed to the automobile pound or sanitary landfill and disposed of in accordance with NDCC Chapter 23.1-15. Such removal by the police department shall not excuse or relieve any person of the obligation imposed by this Ordinance to keep his property free from storage or accumulation of junk automobiles or abandoned vehicles, or parts of either, nor from the penalties for violation thereof.

B. Costs: The costs of any re-

moval of junked automobiles, abandoned vehicles or any other materials for which removal is provided under the provisions of the Ordinances of the City of New Rockford, and the cost of any sanitation improvement required by this Ordinance, shall where applicable, be charged back against the property from which such junk, such junk material, junked or abandoned automobiles or vehicles or debris was removed, to the extent that the entire cost of such abatement of said nuisance shall become a special assessment against such property. Such special assessment shall be levied and assessed against the property involved by the Board of City Commissioners.

10-03-04 Violations and Penalty.

It shall be unlawful to fail to comply with any notice to remove, repair, or desist such nuisance in accordance with any notice as provided for herein, and every day subsequent to such notice in which the violator fails to comply with said notice shall be deemed a separate offense. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the terms of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

### NEW ROCKFORD-SHEYENNE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 REGULAR SCHOOL BOARD MEETING MONDAY, FEBRUARY 14TH, 2022 AT 7:00 P.M.

Members present: Mary Kay Price, Mike Jacobson, Alyson Myhre, Mike Schaefer, Todd Allmaras, Patti Larson, Travis Benson. Others present: Dr. Jill Louters, Superintendent; Natalie Becker, Elementary Principal, Avolt Baumbach, Secondary Principal, Dave Skogen, Business Manager.

President Price called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**Approval of the Agenda**

It was moved by Schaefer and seconded by Larson to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

**Approval of the Consent Agenda**

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Benson to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the minutes from the January 10th, 2022 meeting, the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$49,504.16, the building fund of \$1,750.00, hot lunch fund of \$8,289.68, and the activity fund of \$16,363.05.

**Monthly Committee Reports**

Business Manager Skogen shared with the board the Insurance Committee had met recently to catch up on how NPHIT is going in the school's first year of participation. Also, Secondary Principal Baumbach shared the Curriculum Committee recently met to review secondary curriculum to suggest what is needed in terms of changes or updating.

**Principals' Reports**

Elementary Principal Becker shared her report with the board. The Eddy County Spelling Bee was recently held on February 9th, and the winners will now advance to the State Bee on March 21st in Bismarck. Even though third quarter midterm was February 11th, planning for the '22-'23 school year are well under way. Staff meetings, data review, budget planning are just some of the items already being prepared for the coming year. Lastly, ND State Assessment training was recently held and well as continued MTSS trainings in the near future.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report. Secondary curriculum committee had recently met to discuss options for future offerings. Feedback was used from recent music and student engagement surveys. Planning for the upcoming Winterfest and Graduation are well underway. ACT's and State Assessments will be held soon, as well as continued MTSS trainings. Planning for the '22-'23 school year has begun with budget planning for secondary at the forefront.

**Superintendent Report**

Superintendent Louters shared her report with the board. Preparations for a visit from local legislators is underway as they will be on campus February 17th. Dr. Louters recently was named to the American Association of School Administrators, a new cohort for support of new and existing superintendents of rural schools. A few items continuing or wrapping up are the NDSU Presidential search, Principal Evaluations, work with the NRABC and Sheyenne Economic Development, and work with the music team on how to boost existing participation numbers. Lastly, it was noted that 2022-2023 budget preparations are under way, as well as participation in ND Teacher collaborative where work is being done to rewrite the licensure standards for educators.

**Teacher Report**

Secondary Science teacher Monica Meadows shared with the Board some of the STEM projects her class has been working on recently. She displayed a Sphero, a small programmable robotic ball, that allows the students to learn computer coding & also relays data such as force and velocity. There are lots of small projects students can choose to

try. Students have found some of them hard to get correct the first attempt, which is teaching the lesson of failure, regrouping, and trying again. Mrs. Meadows stated the students really seem to like working with the Sphero, and Student Rep Meier agreed with the statement.

**Student Report**

Student rep Amzi Meier reported he has created a forum for students to share thoughts and concerns to him to share with the Board. Some recent communication stated requests for more vegetables at lunch, as well as some frustration regarding the dress code, specifically the portion on allowance of wearing a hat in school.

**Personnel**

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Benson to accept the resignation of elementary physical education teacher Cherry Heinz carried unanimously. Elementary physical education teacher Cherry Heinz recently submitted her letter of resignation. The board thanked Cherry for her service and dedication to the New Rockford-Sheyenne School district.

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Larson to accept the retirement of secondary business teacher Patricia Rinde. Motion carried unanimously. Patricia recently submitted her request to retire following the current school year. The board thanked Patricia for her years of service to the district.

**Preliminary Budget Discussion**

Discussion was held on the preliminary budget for the 2022-2023 school year. Business Manager Skogen shared a presentation breaking down a variety of budget information for the coming year, both on the revenue and expense side. With 2022-2023 being year two of the accepted Negotiated Agreement, the district is able to start the process of building the budget earlier due to certified staffing expense already agreed upon for returning staff. Discussion was very preliminary and will continue at the March meeting.

**2022-2023 Academic Calendar**

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Allmaras to approve option #1 of the school calendar as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Two options for the 2022-2023 academic calendar were presented to the board. Both options had been presented to faculty, with feedback requested. After limited feedback was provided, the majority of those who did request option #1. Feedback was also requested from parents of Junior class students regarding graduation date, but no feedback was received.

**School Board Election Date**

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Myhre to select June 7th as the date for this year's School Board Election. Motion carried unanimously. NDSBA provided guidance and a timeline for dates important to the school board election. Generally, the election is held the second Tuesday in June, however due to how late the second Tuesday falls, and it's correlation to the monthly board meeting it was decided to hold the election on June 7th. The Board will then canvass the election at its regular held meeting on June 20th.

President Richter called for Garbage Removal Bids to be opened and reviewed. Richter opened each bid and summarized the proposal. A Special Meeting was set for March 21, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. to further discuss and compare the bids, with a possibility of awarding a bid at that time.

Wade Senger from Interstate Engineering was present to update on street project. Senger reported meeting with Richter, Hirschert and Mike May to go over plans and details. The next part of the process requires Interstate Engineering to request bids for the project. Senger will get bid information out to the public and publish the request in next week's paper. Bids will be opened on April 4, 2022, at 3:30 p.m. The bids will be reviewed and discussed at the regular Commission Meeting at evening April 4, 2022. Senger requested a motion to move forward with publishing of bids.

Ystaas made a motion to move forward with the publishing of bids for the Street Project. Hager seconded. In a roll call vote, it was Richter, Belquist, Ystaas, Hager and McKnight all voting aye. No nay votes. Motion carried.

Senger advised Commissioners that the water plant is still on task to be operational by April 30, 2022.

Hager made a motion to approve payment No. 14 for \$25,650.00 to Sentry Crane. Richter seconded the motion. In a roll call vote it was Richter, McKnight, Hager, Belquist, Ystaas all voting aye. No nay votes. Motion carried.

Jeff Hoff, Otter Tail Power Company Energy Management Rep requested to address commission regarding streetlights. Hoff proposed that Otter Tail Power Co. take over the streetlights downtown and along Hwy 281 in New Rockford which the city currently owns and maintains. Otter Tail would replace the current underground wiring, place all new poles downtown and convert the current streetlights to LED lights.

Ystaas made a motion to allow Otter Tail to continue working on a plan to present to Commission for final approval. Hager seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

PWS Hirschert reported that public works has ordered a salt and sand spreader for the Bobcat. PW employees completed a virtual training concerning the backflow program. PW also has replaced water meters that were no longer read. Hirschert has scheduled a cleaning of the clear well. Hirschert requested the commission adopt an ordinance pertaining to the backflow and check valve requirements.

Ystaas made a motion to proceed with drafting and adopting of an appropriate ordinance concerning backflow and check valve

with the waste supply system. McKnight seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

McKnight made a motion to approve the public works report as presented. Richter seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

The second reading for ordinance amendment of Section 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 10 - Junk Automobiles or Abandoned Vehicles and Section 4 of Article 3 of Chapter 10- Violation and Penalty was read.

Hager made a motion to approve the building permit for Noah Ellingson, 102 River View Court, kitchen remodel. Richter seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Blumer, District Judge for the Southeast Judicial District, that he does not intend to be a candidate for his position when his term expires December 31, 2022.
