The New Rockford-Sheyenne junior high team competed at the Central North Dakota Conference (CNDC) Meet in Rugby on Tuesday, May 9.

NR-S seventh grader, Jaida Schumacher, paved the way for the Rockets. Schumacher took first place in three individual events, even nipping the CNDC meet records in all three!

In the 100-meter dash, Schumacher finished in first place with a new meet record of 13.58 seconds. Kale Williams of Benson County set the meet record in 2022 with a time of 13.66 seconds.

Schumacher blazed the 200-meter dash meet record time of 29.69 seconds set back in 2015 by Skylar Arnold of Northern Lights with a time of 28.14 seconds. And finally, in the 400-meter dash, Schumacher took first place with a new meet record time of 1:04.80. Payton DeMers of Northern Lights also beat the prior meet record set by Hallie Hauck of Rugby with a time of 1:09.68 with her second place finish of 1:07.58.

Schumacher also ran as the anchor in the girls 4x200-meter relay alongside Isla Jacobson, Kaci Weisenburger and Karsyn Wetzel. The girls' 4x200-meter relay team took second place behind the Rugby relay team with a time of 2:02.90.

Jacobson, Weisenburger, Kaylynn Chamberlain and Wetzel ran in the 4x100-meter relay that took fourth place with a time of 1:01.95.

Wetzel also competed in the girls' 100-meter dash and the 200-meter dash and

took fourth place in both events with times of 14.67 seconds and 30.75 seconds, respectively.

Jacobson took second place in the girls' 800-meter run with a time of 2:56.02.

Jocee Lawrence and Chamberlain also placed in the top 10 for the girls' team. Chamberlain took third place in girls' triple jump with a jump of 26 feet, 7 inches and seventh in long jump with a jump of 12-3. Lawrence was the lone thrower for the girls' team. Overall, Lawrence placed in sixth with a throw of 26-7.

The girls' team finished in third place with a total of 73 points.

As for the boys' team, Thomas Allmaras was the key athlete.

Allmaras competed in two individual events: the boys' 400-meter dash and long jump. Allmaras took first place in the 400-meter dash with a time of 1:01.24 and second place in long jump with a jump of 18-3. Malaki Kukowski also competed in the boys' long jump and took first place with a jump of 18-6.5. Allmaras and Kukowski jump also beat the meet record that was set by NR-S alumni, Joey Gray, back in 2015. Gray set the record with a jump of 17-10.

Allmaras also ran as the anchor in both the boys' 4x100-meter relay and the boys' 4x200-meter relay.

Along with Allmaras, Layton Jacobson, Aaden Benson and Kukowski made up the relay teams. In the 4x100-meter relay, the boys took second place behind the Harvey/Wells County team with a time of 53.68

seconds. Both HWC and NR-S's 4x100-meter relay teams nixed the meet record time of 54.33 seconds that was set in 2022.

The NR-S boys took first place in the 4x200-meter relay with a new meet record time of 1:49.39. The previous record was held by the Surrey relay team in 2022 with a time of 1:56.44.

Also competing in the boys' 4x100-meter relay was Kolton O'Connor, Alex Knatterud, Jax Demester and Sawyer Huso. The relay team took fifth place overall with a time of 59.37 seconds.

The Rockets had second team in the boys' 4x200-meter relay, that was made up of Dustin Nystrom, Thadison Wobbema, Demester and Huso. The boys' relay team took fifth place with a time of 2:06.78.

In the junior high boys' 200-meter hurdles, Benson took second place with a time of 32.73 seconds; Kason Nass took third place with a time of 33.73 seconds and O'Connor followed in fourth place with a time of 34.30 seconds.

O'Connor also placed in the top 10 for the boys in shot put and discus. O'Connor threw a total of 96-10 in discus to take second place overall and took fifth place in shot put with a throw of 32-0. Jacobson and Chaztin Wobbema competed alongside O'Connor in discus with Jacobson taking third place with a throw of 75-3 and Wobbema taking seventh with a throw of 63-4. Jacobson, Wobbema and

Nystrom all competed in boys' shot put as well, with Jacobson taking third place, Wobbema in sixth and Nystrom in 10th.

Nass was the lone high jumper for the junior high boys and placed sixth with a jump of 4-6.

Other top 10 finishes came from Kukowski in the 100-meter dash with a third place finish; Huso in boys' long jump with an eighth place finish and Gabe Smith in the boys' 1,600-meter run with a 10th place finish.

Overall, the junior high boys' team took second place with a total of 103.5 points behind Rugby's 131.

Approval of the Agenda
It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Benson to approve the agenda with the removal of Item E - Learn Everywhere - NDSU Proposal. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the March 13th Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Schaefer and seconded by Larson to approve the minutes of the March 13th, 2023 meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda
It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Perleberg to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$52,245.85, the activity fund of \$5,530.60, and the food service fund of \$11,470.96.

Monthly Committee Reports
Negotiations committee met to discuss negotiations strate-

gy and set a date to set ground rules for negotiations. Transportation met with the drivers just to discuss routes and benefits.

Principals' Reports
Elementary Principal Becker presented her report to the board. Elementary Academic Challenge will be held on April 13th. 12 participants will compete in Harvey. Teacher evaluations will be completed by the April 15th deadline. Thus far progress has been seen in various areas, with growth still needed in the area of engagement and creativity. Lastly, Principal Becker shared the Stronger Connections Grant application has been submitted. This grant would feature federal funding to support the professional development of positive behavioral intervention and support and continued events with Sources of Strength.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report to the board. North Dakota State Assessments with finish on April 24th. A recent trip to the NDSU Research Center allowed 11 students to visit and explore the potential partnership with the center. This partnership would feature field based learning for students. On April 20th staff will visit Horace High School to tour their pod style school system. The MTSS team has been asked to present this summer at a conference. The staff is excited and honored to share their experiences and successes with other districts.

Superintendent Report
Superintendent Louters

shared her report with the board. Website link development and an establishment of protocols is underway with dot.com therapy. Candidate tours, interviews and communication regarding employment package is on going with the staff openings in the district.

The district recently obtained a grant in support of April's Child Abuse Prevention events. As will be discussed later ongoing work with Pace Fundraising and the second gym fundraising efforts continues.

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Benson to approve the resignation of Julie Westrick. Motion carried majority vote. The board thanked Julie for her time and service to the district.

Second Gym Update

Dr. Louters updated the board on the Second Gym fundraising efforts. She discussed with the board the fundraising preparation process the committee is going through with Pace Fundraising. Once the preparations are completed, full fundraising efforts hope to be launched within the next couple months.
