President Jacobson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Price to approve the agenda with the Addition of Item K – Appointment of Strategic Planning Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the April 10th Regular & May 4th Special Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Schaefer and seconded by Allmaras to approve the minutes of the April 10th regular & May 4th special meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda

It was moved by Price and seconded by Benson to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

The consent agenda consisted of the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$109,474.73, the building fund of \$1,437.26 activity fund of \$3,171.23, and the food service fund of \$13,439.70

Monthly Committee Reports

The negotiations committee met a few times to negotiate and complete negotiations with the teachers.

Principals' Reports

Elementary Principal Becker presented her report to the board. Donna Anderson from NDSU Extension worked with grades 1 and 2 on a bread-in-a-bag project. Project was part of a family engagement and activity planning effort. A Stronger Connections Grant was applied for and granted. This grant award is for \$110,000 and will help cover the cost of PBIS and expanded Sources of Strength efforts in the district. Lastly, summer school planning is well underway. Summer school is set for June 5th-29th, and will run Monday through Thursday's from 8:30am-10:00am. Focus of summer school will be in the areas of reading and math.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report to the board. A recent trip was made to Horace High School, to see how they have implemented their capstone projects, and educational pods. Was good to see in action the direction our district is heading towards. The middle school student council took in a conference in Bismarck recently. End of year planning for graduation, senior supper, awards night and senior bbq is well underway and fast approaching. Lastly, master schedule planning is well underway. An emphasis on junior and senior core classes in the morning is at the forefront to allow for more choice in the afternoon for each student.

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Louters shared her report with the board. The bulk of the last month had to do with hiring processes, solicitation of candidates, interviews, and reference checks. Quality candidates have emerged for numerous positions. Work with Lift Learning will begin soon to help create a robust platform for students and staff. Lastly, work relating to the pretrial hearing process and preparing for the May 18th meeting.

Teacher Report

Elementary Physical Education & ELL Teacher Nathan Jensen presented to the board. An Artist in Residence grant was applied for and granted recently. This grant allowed for the opportunity for students to cross curriculum physical education with science. Jensen noted it was a great experience for all involved. Jensen stated that ELL numbers have gone from three to two, but with new families coming into the district that number could change quickly. Lastly, Jensen spoke to the excitement he has with the district taking on Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports more commonly known as "PBIS". PBIS is an evidence-based tiered framework to improve and integrate all the data, systems, and practices affecting student outcomes every day.

Student Report

Members of the track team spoke to the board regarding the experience at the Howard Wood Relays. The prestigious meet was held in Sioux Falls, SD. NR-S athletes performed really well, and the board congratulated them on their success and how they represented the district.

Personnel – Resignation Heather Klocke

It was moved by Benson and seconded by Allmaras to approve the resignation of Heather Klocke.

Motion carried unanimously. Klocke taught elementary music for the district. The board thanked her for her time and service to the district.

Personnel – Resignation Monica Meadows

It was moved by Schaefer and seconded by Allmaras to approve the resignation of Monica Meadows. Motion carried unanimously.

Meadows taught high school science. The board thanked her for her time and service to the district.

Recommendation to Hire

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Price to approve the hiring of Krystal Caldwell as a high school science teacher.

Review of Pledge of Securities

It was moved by Larson and seconded by Allmaras to approve the review of pledge of securities as presented. On a quarterly basis the board reviews the pledge of securities, which provides coverage for any district assets over and above FDIC limits at Bank Forward.

Policy GAGC – NDSU Proposal

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Benson to approve the proposal as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The proposal will allow students to have research opportunities in the area of agronomy and crop and weed science at the NDSU research center in Carrington. Students will be able to have hands on experience with licensed NDSU staff.

Community Foundation Transfer – Pace Fundraising

It was moved by Benson and seconded by Jacobson to request the transfer or withdrawal of \$11,979.74 from the New Rockford-Sheyenne Public School Non-Endowment Fund for the purpose of paying Pace Fundraising as per the contract previously signed. Motion carried unanimously. Motion allows for funds to be sent from the foundation set up for the Second Gym project, to the district, to pay for Pace Fundraising. These funds requested were specifically earmarked by project donors for this exact use.

HELP CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Eddy County Weed Board reminds all landowners that state law requires the control of noxious weeds.

4.1-47-02 Control of noxious weeds

1. Each person shall do all things necessary and proper to control the spread of noxious weeds

2. No person may distribute, sell, or offer for sale within this state a noxious weed

The Eddy County Weed Board is offering a cost share program for chemical for control of noxious weeds on qualifying land. Cost share rates are as follows:

- 80% cost share for Tordon up to 10 gallons
- 50% cost share for 2-4D up to 20 gallons
- The 2-4D must be tank mixed with Tordon at 2:1 (2 parts 2-4D to 1 part Tordon)
- 80% cost share for Plateau (or the generic version) up to 4 gallons
- 50% cost share for Milestone up to 5 gallons

In order to receive reimbursement you must submit a copy of an invoice or receipt to prove purchase of chemical and also a copy of the maps with sprayed areas highlighted to the Eddy County Weed Board. They can be mailed to Eddy County Weed Board, 205 3rd St. SE, New Rockford, ND 58556 or dropped off at the Eddy County Extension office or emailed to eddywco@outlook.com.

Requests for reimbursement must be received at the office by NOV 1, 2023. If you have questions contact Corey Longnecker at 302-0418.
