Mowing along the slope and ditch bottom must have a maximum stubble height of 4 inches. The minimum width of cut must be no less than 9 feet.  
 Areas that are hayed must also meet the 4" stubble height requirement.  
 Haystacks and bales must be removed by October 1 or they will be disposed of so they will not create a snow problem.  
 Failure to comply with this order will result in the cost of mowing being charged to the Eddy County landowner.  
 All taxpayers that do not want to be charged for mowing ditches along their property must have this work completed before October 1.

 The Wells County Weed Control Board will again do COST SHARING. Cost sharing is done on non crop land, such as hay land, pasture land, CRP land, etc. Producers are asked to provide:  
 1. A map showing spots of each noxious weed sprayed along with legal land description and acres of each weed sprayed.  
 2. Photocopies of chemical invoices listing amount of herbicide cost and your social security number, which is now required for any dollar amount received.  
 3. Deadline to mail in your cost sharing is October 25, 2023.  
 4. Mail your cost sharing to Wells County Weed Control Board, PO Box 2, Fessenden, ND 58438-0002. All cost sharing submitted must have a post mark.  
 Examples of Chemicals that will be cost shared on this year will be Tordon, 2,4D, Plateau, Overdrive, Milestone, Forefront, Chaparel, Escort XP, Cimmaron, Banvel, Latigo and Surfactants.  
 In accordance with Chapter 4.1-47-02. Control of noxious weeds - Responsibility. Each person shall do all things necessary and proper to control the spread of noxious weeds. Penalties are provided for in Chapter 4.1-47-30 and Chapter 4.1-47-31.  
 Pursuant to Chapter 4.1-47 in the North Dakota Century Code book, the following weeds have been declared noxious:

NEW ROCKFORD CITY COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING AUGUST 28, 2023

President Richter called the Public Hearing to order at 8:00 am at City Hall with Commissioner Hewitt, Commissioner Belquist, Commissioner McKnight present. Also, present Attorney Peterson. Commissioner Ystaas joined the meeting at 8:15 am.

Belquist made a motion to approve the agenda, McKnight seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

Richter opened the Public Hearing. Brenda Ridge was present representing the house at 306 2nd Ave. N. Ridge requested additional time for demolition; the house is uninhabited. The home was deemed blighted, dangerous, and substandard. Belquist made a motion to approve the Final Order of Demolition, no later than July 1, 2024. Ystaas seconded the motion. In discussion it was agreed that the city would provide Ridge with a quote for the cost of demolition, giving Ridge the option to accept the bid, or Ridge may obtain bids separately. In a roll call vote it was, Richter, Hewitt, Belquist, Ystaas, and McKnight voting "aye" no "nay" votes. Motion carried.

MINUTES OF EDDY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING EDDY COUNTY COURTHOUSE AUGUST 1, 2023, 8:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order by Dave Gehrtz, Chairperson. Also present were Commissioner Glenda Collier, Commissioner James Allmaras, Auditor Patty Williams, States Attorney Ashley Lies, and Nathan Price, New Rockford Transcript.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the agenda, and the motion was seconded by Dave Gehrtz. The motion carried.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the minutes of the July

5, 2023, meeting. James Allmaras seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

After review of the financials and expenditure and revenue budgets for the month of July 2023, a motion was made by Dave Gehrtz to approve both the financials and budgets. The motion was seconded by James Allmaras, and the motion carried.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the following bills, and it was seconded by James Allmaras. Roll call vote: Collier, Gehrtz, and Allmaras voted aye.

Table listing various entities and their amounts, including Aflic Inc., Kathy Anderson, AT&T Mobility, Axon Enterprise Inc, Butler Machinery Co., CenDak Cooperative, Cenex Fleetcard, etc.

OLD BUSINESS:

The bill received from Interstate Engineering, Inc. for plans for the Sheyenne County shop in the amount of \$8,790 was discussed. Dave Gehrtz made a motion to approve the bill for payment, and it was seconded by Glenda Collier. The motion carried.

The boundary survey and certificate of survey map of the south line of the SW1/4 and the west line of Section 36, T150N, R64W in Hillsdale Township was reviewed. This survey was performed by Tamarac Land Surveying, LLC to fulfill the agreement made with Attorney Joshua Wolfe, Ohnstad Twichell, P.C., addressing concerns about the improvements made to this section line road.

There were ten applications received for the road sign position. There was no decision made, and it will be discussed again at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ashley Peterson, Administrator, Lake Region District Health Unit, explained their 2024 budget request in the amount of \$75,480. Tanya Munson, Business Man-

ager, and Angie Hopfau, Ambulance Manager, New Rockford Community Ambulance Service, explained their 2024 budget request in the amount of \$92,350.

Merita Aldayel, Eddy County Museum & Historical Society, gave an update on the improvements made at the museum and explained their 2024 budget request in the amount of \$12,805.

Julie Shrock, Veterans Service Officer, gave an update and explained her 2024 budget request in the amount of \$27,956.

Stuart Richter, City of New Rockford President, presented new plans for the runway, taxiway, and apron rehabilitation project at the airport with an estimated cost of \$2.1 million. The ND Aeronautics Commission will cover between 60% and 70% of this cost. The City is requesting assistance from the County in funding the remaining amount, split equally between the City and County. The Commissioners will be asking for input from County residents before making any decision.

The ND Association of Counties Convention will be held in Bismarck, ND, on October 8-10, 2023.

The Commissioners reviewed the donation request letter received from the Safe Alternatives for Abused Families. After receiving input from Ashley Lies, States Attorney, as to their presence in court, Glenda Collier made a motion to make no donation. The motion was seconded by Dave Gehrtz, and the motion carried.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the Lease Agreement with Gretchen Berglund and Keegan Anderson for a wedding reception at the fairgrounds on September 2, 2023. James Allmaras seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the Special Permits to Sell Alcoholic Beverages at Special Event at Designated Premises with Hanson's Bar for wedding receptions on August 12, 2023, and September 23, 2023. James Allmaras seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

The letter received from Doug Goehring, Agriculture Commissioner, regarding noxious weed complaints was reviewed. This letter was passed on to Corey Longnecker, who is a member of the Eddy County Weed Board. The Commissioners discussed ideas on how to address these concerns including putting a Commissioner on the Weed Board and the possibility of sharing a weed officer with a surrounding County.

The Commissioners discussed the sale of a 10-acre tract in the NW1/4 of Section 36, T150N, R66W that the County currently owns. Ashley Lies, States Attorney, informed the Commission that if the value is less than \$1,000, it can be sold at private sale. If the value is \$1,000 or more, it must be sold at a public sale either by auction or as sealed bids. The value of this tract will be brought to the next meeting, and it will be discussed further as to how to proceed.

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations and changes for the 2023-24 chronic wasting disease proclamation.

Whole carcasses of animals harvested in North Dakota can remain in the deer unit or may now be transported anywhere in the state. However, carcass waste must be disposed of via landfill or waste management provider. This does not apply to heads dropped at CWD collection sites or lymph nodes submitted for CWD surveillance. Taxidermists and game processors can also accept intact carcasses of animals harvested within North Dakota but assume responsibility for disposal.

Hunters are prohibited from transporting into North Dakota the whole carcass or parts, except the lower-risk portions, of deer, elk, moose or other members of the cervid family harvested outside of North Dakota.
