George Reck with Aqua Pure has been at the Water Treatment Plant numerous times in the past months trying different scenarios and changing chemicals to see what works best with the water coming into the water plant. Water testing at the Water Plant has seen major improvements. The filters in the RO units have been lasting longer than in previous months with the new chemical. If the chemicals are switched to Aqua Pure's chemicals, the cost will be at a set contract price each month. Projected costs with Aqua Pure will be significantly less than the current chemical supplier.
