*N.D. Game & Fish Dept. Dist. game wardens: East end of Lake Sakakawea remains slow. Access and moving around on area lakes is generally improving as snow settles. No reports from Devils Lake or east-central area lakes.

*Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: No new reports.

*Devils Lake, Lakeview Lodge, Minnewaukan: Devils Lake generally remains slow for walleye.

*Devils Lake, West Bay Resort, Minnewaukan: Still generally slow for walleye.

*Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Generally slow and scattered walleye and perch success.

*Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: Somewhat improving pike success on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Walleye remain slow. Weather permitting, look for occasional walleye from the Missouri River tailrace. Lake Audubon slow and spotty for walleye.

*Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon/Missouri River, Scott's Bait and Tackle, Pick City: Better walleye success on the east end of Lake Sakakawea is around Beulah and Beaver bays. Overall success slow remains slow on both Lake Sakakawea and Lake Audubon, however. No Missouri River tailrace reports.

Approval of the Agenda

It was moved by Myhre and seconded by Jacobson to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the minutes from the December 13th, 2021 meeting, the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$164,423.60, hot lunch fund of \$7,197.36, and the activity fund of \$3,509.50

Opportunity For Comments From the Public On Agenda Items

Sheyenne resident Laural Westby spoke regarding the East Central Mediation item.

Monthly Committee Reports

Board Member Larson briefed the board on a recent Building Committee meeting. Committee recently met regarding the Bus Storage project and prioritization of needs of upcoming building maintenance. Larson mentioned that the flat roof located from the handicap accessible doors to the main office is a priority and quotes will be requested. A new option for the bus storage project is the potential for a smaller building to house the rocket bus with the potential to add on down the road if deemed necessary.

Principals' Reports

Elementary Principal Becker shared her report with the board. As the second semester and third quarter begin, curriculum planning with staff as well as teacher observations continue. MTSS trainings also will continue in the coming weeks with Wayne Callander coming to the school at the upcoming in-service. Eddy County Spelling Bee will be coming up and preparations for that are underway.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report. As reported by Principal Becker, Principal Baumbach also shared on the continued training and work with MTSS. Planning for the ACT's is underway with a March 9th test date planned. The ACT's will be fully online, and accommodations are being prepared where needed. ASVAB and STAR testing are coming up this week. Semester one grades are being finalized and students have been met with for semester two class scheduling.

Teacher observations continue, as does weekly student support team, IEP & secondary staff meetings.

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Louters shared her report with the board. Transportation has been a consistent topic throughout the month as storage, scheduling and maintenance have each required attention. Coordination for CDL training and hiring a new route driver, as well as consultations regarding a bus storage site are some examples. '22-'23 Budget preparations are underway as current expenditures are being reviewed for forthcoming budget considerations. Pre-school has been a recent focus following a community survey, and a presentation will be given tonight including recommendations of cost and day length for the program. Lastly, continued work in the NDSU presidential search process. Main takeaways are student focus, equity and inclusion, personalized learning and more collaboration from PK-16.

Teacher Report

Elementary Teacher Alaina Yri reported to the board on the Kindness Club. Kindness Club was started 4-5 years ago and involves students in grades 1st-6th. They average about 12 students a meeting. Meetings are led primarily by student discussion, in which they are able to talk about the good things and the troubles they may face during the day. Recently the group reached out to a similar group in Louisiana.

Student Report

Student rep Amzi Meier reported that Christmas break was well received by students as the break was well needed. Coming back he has felt better moral from fellow students. ACT/SAT are coming up and students are already starting to feel the nerves of the upcoming tests.

Pre-School Presentation

Item was tabled until the budget is started and no motion was made. Superintendent Louters and Elementary Principal Becker shared a presentation that was prepared by the pre-school committee regarding the pre-school program. Presentation shared information on the financial cost to the school, current charge per student, statistically proven benefits of the program, length of school day consideration, and review of a community survey that was recently completed. Recommendation to the board was to keep the length of day as a half day, and increase the student fee to \$75. Board discussed the topic but would prefer to wait until the '22-'23 budget is started before any final decision is made.

East Central Mediation

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Larson to proceed to enter into third party mediation with East Central. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion was held regarding an invitation from East Central to enter into mediation with a third-party mediator. Consensus after lengthy discussion was a third party might aid in obtaining answers to questions previously asked by NR-S to East Central that have remained unanswered. Once mediation is concluded the board would have the information needed to decide on the future of the relationship.

Cognia Review

Item was discussion-only as Superintendent Louters presented to the board the final review from the Cognia Accreditation

Review. The review was an overwhelming success for NR-S, but did show a couple areas to strive to improve in. The review showed many areas where NR-S achieved the highest score, Impact Level. An IEQ of 275 and above indicates the institution is beginning to reach the Impact level and is engaged in practices that are sustained over time and are becoming ingrained in the culture of the institution. NR-S was awarded a final score of 295 just shy of an Impact Level total score.

Bus Storage Project - RFQ Request

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Schaefer to begin the RFQ process. Motion carried with five yes votes to one no vote. The NR-S building committee has met and discusses the potential for a storage building to house district owned transportation. Discussion on size needed and location has been ongoing. RFQ request will help NR-S obtain necessary information regarding options of size, location, and in time official quotes for the project.

Main Hall Roof - Request for Bid

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Jacobson to approve the request for bids. Motion carried unanimously. Main hall roof which runs from the handicap doors down to the west end of the building has leaked occasionally. A recent inspection requested the roof be replaced as soon as possible but could be repaired with continued maintenance to get through another year if needed. Roof leaked a couple times during the fall of '21 in numerous places.

Review Pledge of Securities

It was moved by Jacobson and seconded by Myhre to approve the Pledge of Securities as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Quarterly review of the Pledge of Securities as sent out by Bank Forward and the Bank of North Dakota. The pledge states that any balance held with Bank Forward that is over the FDIC insured limit is indeed guaranteed and protected by a pledge pool held by the Bank of North Dakota.

Wade Senger from Interstate Engineering reported on the water treatment plant. RO piping is almost complete, regular meetings are conducted to keep all involved informed. Temporary water hookup will be implemented in late February or early March. This hookup will be in place for 4-6 weeks, depending on progress of project. A notice will go out to residents regarding the change in temporary water installation. Senger presented payment request for payment No. 13 for approval. The payment due to Sentry Crane is \$69,654.08. Senger reported on Street Project, Senger and design team met with Hirschert and Richter to go over details and progress. Senger is aiming to have a plan for approval in place for next meeting. The goal is to have bids open in April. Senger suggested that we use Scott Wagner for bond attorney as John Arnston (previous city bond attorney) has retired.

Hager moved to approve payment No. 13 for \$69,654.08 to Sentry Crane. Richter seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried. Amanda Hegland from NRABC presented a proposal to the Commission requesting the permission to explore the option of converting the Club Room at the Brown Memorial into a day care/center. Hegland's proposal included surveys from local families, a list of current providers, income and expenses from recent years at the Brown, an overview of what other communities have done, community support letters and a plan to move forward. Hegland is working on grant funds to help fund the possible project. NRABC has deemed childcare as one of the top priorities and needs in New Rockford as determined by their strategic planning process. Hegland's proposal to use the Club Room, kitchen and gym would still allow for the general public to continue to utilize the kitchen and gym - with some time frame limitations. Hegland also introduced a city app option that she is continuing to research.

McKnight moved to approve NRABC to continue to explore the possibility of converting the Club Room into a day care. Belquist seconded. In further discussion, Richter mentioned the outside has green space available for play equipment. Hegland also responded by stating that before any concrete decisions are made, she would return to the commission with a plan. Richter, Belquist, Ystaas, Hager and McKnight all voted in favor of the motion. No nays. Motion carried. Rick Swenson reported on information he obtained from the ND Rural Water Expo. There will be a mandated backflow containment program initiated and a lead/copper rule revision. Swenson and public works were encouraged to begin with the process, as a plan is due by April 1, 2022.

PWS Hirschert's report was presented in writing. The report included: hauling and moving snow, hiring trucks to move big piles of snow, keeping alleys open for WM and residents. Hirschert is clearing the airport snow as needed, and the PW department has been busy with Brown rentals. Hirschert supplied a quote for new highway 281 winter decorations. McKnight moved to

purchase 15 snowflake decoration for the streetlights at the discounted rate. Hager seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried. McKnight made a motion to approve the public works report as presented. Richter seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

The first reading for ordinance amendment of Section 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 10 - Junk Automobiles or Abandoned Vehicles and Section 4 of Article 3 of Chapter 10 - Violation and Penalty was read.

Hager moved to approve the housing incentives for Brendon Ruppell at 417 2nd Ave. South. Hager seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

McKnight moved to approve the local gaming permits for New Rockford Dollars for Scholars - sports pool. Richter seconded. All were in favor, motion carried.

Hager moved to approve the building permit for ATP Properties for remodel at 510 1st Avenue South. Richter seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Hager moved to approve the Local Renaissance Zone Authority for new construction at 182 1st Street North. Belquist seconded. All were in favor, motion carried.

Richter presented the Specification for Garbage Hauling document. Times and dates were discussed.

In the Matter of the Application for Disciplinary Action Against Ashley L. Lies, a Person Admitted to the Bar of the State of North Dakota

Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court of the State of North Dakota, Petitioner v. Ashley L. Lies, Respondent

No. 6616-NE-2102

Ashley L. Lies was retained to represent a client regarding a civil matter, which was settled. Lies admitted she was negligent when she brought a second petition in the same matter by not having the legal knowledge necessary regarding claim preclusion and related concepts and by not understanding the terms of the settlement agreement. Because of her conduct, her client and the opposing parties incurred unnecessary legal expenses to resolve the second petition, which were paid by a trust and depleted trust assets. Lies admitted her conduct was negligent and violated N.D.R. Prof. Conduct 1.1. Lies, disciplinary counsel, and the hearing panel acknowledged mitigating factors that Lies has no prior discipline history or a dishonest or selfish motive. She was experiencing personal problems and mental health issues at the time of the representation. She was cooperative with the disciplinary process and has shown remorse. Lies consented to a reprimand by the hearing panel, was required to complete three hours of continuing legal education related to civil litigation with an attempt to focus on the issues of collateral estoppel and res judicata within 90 days, and was required to pay costs and expenses in the amount of \$250.
