**by Nathan Price** At the 2022 State B Tournament in Bismarck, this year's New Rockford-Sheyenne volleyball team weren't just representing their community with a fantastic showing, they were also cementing their place in local history.

By advancing to state as regional champs, Kelsie Belquist, Lora Wobbema, Kaiya O'Connor, Kyria Dockter, Madisen Myhre, Ava Peterson and this year's entire team and staff, have done what no other team in the history of New Rockford volleyball

But what exactly is the history of volleyball in New Rockford? When did it start, how has it changed over the years, and what does New Rockford's first volleyball team think of the latest team's success?

When discussing the history of New Rockford's volleyball program, these are just a few of the questions that could come to

As it happens, the "New Rockford Transcript" keeps every newspaper it's ever printed dating all the way back to the 19th century. And in light of NR-S volleyball's history-making success in 2022, it is perhaps the perfect time to answer some of those questions.

The first volleyball recap ever printed in the paper was published in the Transcript's 25th edition of Volume 108 - Saturday, Dec. 14, 1991.

Yes, back in those days volleyball was a winter sport, and began in early December. It had taken the place of gymnastics - a



match was somewhat of a learning experience for everybody, from players and coaches to the good turnout of involved spectators," wrote Aslakson.

"And while doubtlessly much valuable experience was gained Tuesday, New Rockford assistant coach Shelly Ehni said afterwards that one of the lessons the Rockets learned was a very basic one. 'They learned they could do it,' she smiled."

Playing for New Rockford High School's first volleyball team were Shelby Belquist, Renee Erickson, Rachael Otto, Chris Manly, Joayne Larson, Bobbi Boyle, Amy Vorland, Leah Shaefer and Brandi Boyle. Coaches were Tami Reis and Shelley Ehni.

Joayne Larson, who played with the team for their 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons, said she was excited when it was first announced that volleyball was coming to New Rockford.

"I was excited because I liked volleyball," she said. "I remember that my mom had played in a local volleyball team ... and we had played it in phy-ed classes, so I was super excited to have volleyball be a varsity sport."

Larson added that much has changed about volleyball in the years since she first played as a junior and senior in high school.

Anyone familiar with volleyball will have immediately noticed the strange score line Aslakson included in his article. When volleyball first started in North Dakota, sets were only played to 15 points, not 25 as it is today.

scoring worked in volleyball was vastly different than how it works today. In the early 90s, the only way a team could score points was if they were serving.

For the team on defense, even if they returned the opponent's serve and successfully spiked the volleyball over the net, there were no points given, only a change of possession. This often led to long, drawn-out matches that could drag late into the night, even

when only playing to 15 points.
Some matches didn't last quite so long, however, which was likely the case when the Rockets played their second match of 1991, and their first ever against the Carrington Cardinals. Funnily enough, their match against Carrington was actually meant to be their first in program history - originally scheduled for December 2, 1991 - until it was postponed.

Unlike NRHS and Midkota, the 1991-92 season was not the first for Cardinals volleyball, and it showed.

"In the first official meeting of what promises to become a long and colorful series with Carrington," began Aslakson in the Dec. 21, 1991 Transcript, "the Cardinals breezed to a 15-0 first game before winning the next two for their 3-0 match win."

After the Carrington loss, the Rockets went on to defeat Maddock-Esmond two days later in a five-set thriller. Despite their inexperience in volleyball, the Rockets were hanging in there against more experienced teams, That's largely because the way while beating a handful of others. even more.

In the end, they managed to end their first season with a 6-12 overall record. And having gained experience, they returned the following season and enjoyed far greater success.

They ended the 1992-93 regular season with a 16-8 overall record, earning a regional tournament showing in Rugby, where they finished in third place with a 3-0 win over Dunseith.

Larson attributed their early success to the team's overall athleticism, which was able to shine once they'd gained volleyball experience.

"We had a really strong basketball team," said Larson, "and our starting five from the basketball team was the core of the starting six for the volleyball team. ...  $W\!\bar{e}$ were a strong volleyball team because we were strong athletes."

It's easy to draw comparisons to today's volleyball team. Larson mentioned Rachael Otto by name as a particularly strong basketball player, whose talents translated well to volleyball. Today, Kelsie Belquist, Kaiya O'Connor and others are already winning basketball games just weeks after the state volleyball tournament.

In the three decades since vollevball first came to New Rockford, the Rockets have made several appearances in the third place match at regionals, but hadn't competed in a championship match until this year.

This strong group of female athletes is delivering success on the court; and this time next year, they intend to have achieved
